First Reading: Exodus 20:1-17

The Ten Commandments

- ²⁰ God spoke, and these were his words: ² "I am the LORD your God who brought you out of Egypt, where you were slaves.
- ³ "Worship no god but me.
- 4 "Do not make for yourselves images of anything in heaven or on earth or in the water under the earth. 5 Do not bow down to any idol or worship it, because I am the LORD your God and I tolerate no rivals. I bring punishment on those who hate me and on their descendants down to the third and fourth generation. 6 But I show my love to thousands of generations of those who love me and obey my laws.
- ⁷ "Do not use my name for evil purposes, for I, the LORD your God, will punish anyone who misuses my name.
- ⁸ "Observe the Sabbath and keep it holy. ⁹ You have six days in which to do your work, ¹⁰ but the seventh day is a day of rest dedicated to me. On that day no one is to work—neither you, your children, your slaves, your animals, nor the foreigners who live in your country. ¹¹ In six days I, the LORD, made the earth, the sky, the seas, and everything in them, but on the seventh day I rested. That is why I, the LORD, blessed the Sabbath and made it holy.
- ¹² "Respect your father and your mother, so that you may live a long time in the land that I am giving you.
- 13 "Do not commit murder.
- 14 "Do not commit adultery.
- ¹⁵ "Do not steal.
- ¹⁶ "Do not accuse anyone falsely.
- ¹⁷ "Do not desire another man's house; do not desire his wife, his slaves, his cattle, his donkeys, or anything else that he owns."

Gospel Reading: Matthew 4:1-11

The Temptation of Jesus

- 4 Then the Spirit led Jesus into the desert to be tempted by the Devil. ² After spending forty days and nights without food, Jesus was hungry. ³ Then the Devil came to him and said, "If you are God's Son, order these stones to turn into bread."
- ⁴ But Jesus answered, "The scripture says, 'Human beings cannot live on bread alone, but need every word that God speaks.'"
- ⁵ Then the Devil took Jesus to Jerusalem, the Holy City, set him on the highest point of the Temple, ⁶ and said to him, "If you are God's Son, throw yourself down, for the scripture says,
- 'God will give orders to his angels about you; they will hold you up with their hands, so that not even your feet will be hurt on the stones.'"
- ⁷ Jesus answered, "But the scripture also says, 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'"
- ⁸ Then the Devil took Jesus to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world in all their greatness. ⁹ "All this I will give you," the Devil said, "if you kneel down and worship me."
- 10 Then Jesus answered, "Go away, Satan! The scripture says, 'Worship the Lord your God and serve only him!'"
- ¹¹Then the Devil left Jesus; and angels came and helped him.
